Monday, August 25

Do you know anyone or have met anyone with the name Delilah? It hasn't been a very popular name over the past few decades but in the last few years (since 2018) Delilah has been in the top 100 hundred names for children born in those years. Do you have any preconceived notions about the name Delilah? What do you think when you hear the words "Samson and Delilah?" Do you know what the name Delilah means? Contemplate these questions and wrote your thoughts here.

Tuesday, August 26

Read Judges 13:1-5. If you have time read the entire chapter, it's twenty-five verses long. It begins with the many rules by which Manoah and his wife shall teach their son, who is to be named Samson. To not eat anything that is unclean and not to drink "wine or strong drink." He is also never to let a razor touch his head and cut his hair. For the observance of theses rules Samson will be the deliverer of Israelite people from the Philistine occupation. Some religious rules are meant to keep God's people safe while others are meant to demonstrate our love for and obedience to God. Have you heard of these rules? What other "Biblical rules" have you heard? What do you believe to be their purpose? How does obedience to these rules demonstrate our love of God? Meditate on these rules and write your reflections here.

Wednesday, August 27

Read as much of Judges, chapters 14 and 15 as you can; it's 40 verses all together and reads quickly as a narrative of Samson's misspent life, from his marriage to a Philistine woman to the killing of a thousand men with the jawbone of a donkey. Samson is obviously a strong man, but his leadership qualities and integrity seem to be lacking. His parents tried to guide him
