opportunity to share with the staff the importance of play. She mentioned the power of play as relating to mental health, physical exercise and how play influences how we mature into adults.

I have always known that play is important, but after our meeting, Patty gave me a 48-page, 2024 paper from The Institute on Play on the power of play. I can't possibly explain all the nuances of how play helps us to become healthy and balanced human beings, but I do want to share one simple idea: Play is the place where we find ourselves. When we play we immerse ourselves in a situation where we discover our capacity for joy, as we lose ourselves in experiences of cooperation and competition (team sports), fear (roller coasters) and hiking or rock climbing (accomplishments and mastery).

As the "unofficial" end of summer has arrived and we get down to the busyness of work, meetings, school and burdened schedules, don't forget to play. God created us out of love and for God's joy. Let's share in that joy! As always, I look forward to seeing you in worship.

Fueling Kids' Futures Is Back in Swing

Fall is here, and students are back in school. The Fueling Kids' Future team is ready to pack bags of food for some of the students to take home for the weekends. Fueling Kids' Futures is part of a program involving 17 other communities in SE Michigan. Volunteers from our church and other groups help in packing and delivering the bags of food to the classrooms after hours, where they are ready for teachers to hand out. Central church has been supporting this great program since 2011, when it was called Blessings in a Backpack.

This year we are working in three Waterford elementary schools – Donelson Hills, Riverside, and Knudsen, serving approximately 220 students. The food we pack is purchased through Kroger from donations made by individuals, churches, community organizations, and businesses. The cost per child for last year was \$160 and you are welcome to donate funds to help feed kids over the weekend.


